#### The Wednesday Word

"One of the greatest gifts the Holy Spirit can bestow on us is to give us calm in the midst of trouble." St Claude de la Colombiere

Ask your child what the word 'calm' means to them. What sometimes makes them upset or afraid? When was the last time they really needed some help? Who do they know to be a very calm person - someone who is always ready to help them when they are afraid or upset? Has your child ever asked Jesus to help them to stay calm, or asked Jesus for help when they were upset?

God wants us to bring peace and calm to others too. Whenever we are afraid or troubled, we can pray to Jesus. Just sitting quietly with Jesus can be enough to calm us. Is there anyone you know at school, at work or in the community who may be troubled, frightened or upset? What can you do to help them? Perhaps you can: tell a teacher or your parents; ask them if you can help in any way; say a prayer for them.

#### Term Time Holiday Requests

#### **Barnet Family Autism Hub**

Barnet Family Services are excited to share they are in the beginning stages of creating a Barnet Family Autism Hub in conjunction with Resources for Autism. This initiative aims to create a neuro-affirmative space for those who love and care for Autistic children and young people, providing a one-stop community hub where families can access pre- and post-diagnosis information and resources. The support offered will be based on family needs rather than solely on diagnosis. The hub will feature multi-agency collaboration from the voluntary sector, education, social care, and health services.

Barnet has requested schools share this information with the parents of Autistic children, those on the pathway to diagnosis, and those identified as having social communication differences

To ensure the hub meets community needs, as many parents as possible are being encouraged to participate in a survey, as your feedback is crucial in shaping the services and support provided.
